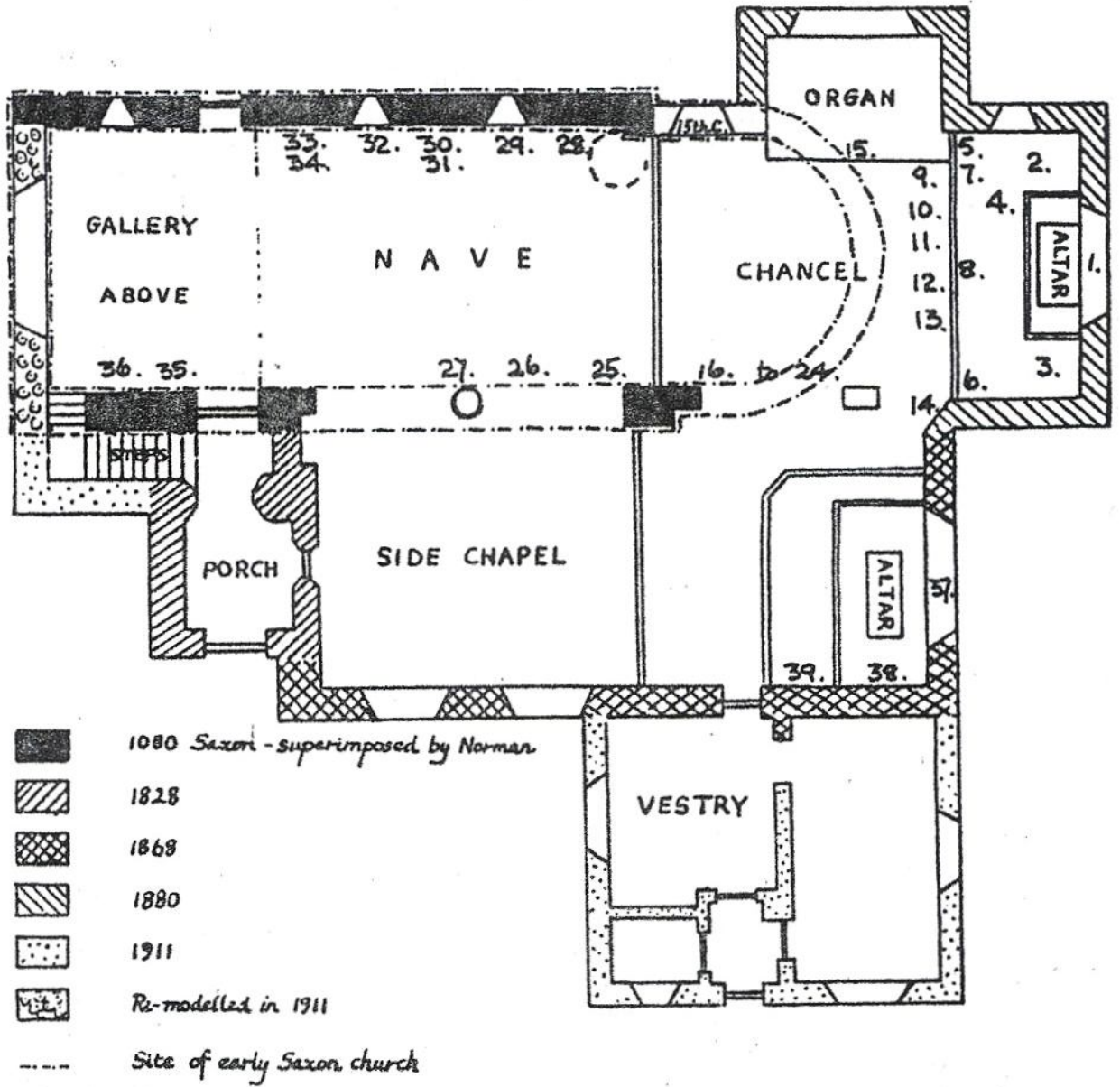

INTRODUCTION

The history of this Church was well documented in the late nineteenth century in *The Parish of East Barnet* by the Reverend Frederick Cass, then Rector of Monken Hadley, and in the excellent current booklet by Mr Will Taylor, a former churchwarden, from which our cover picture and plan have been copied. The numbers on the plan here represent the approximate positions of the memorials listed. From the plan it will be seen that the North Wall and South Doorway are the oldest parts of the building, and that many extensions and alterations were made in the nineteenth and twentieth centuries. Considerable restoration had to be undertaken after damage in the last war, including replacement of the ceiling which was of plaster with fifteenth century painting, and which could not be preserved.

Historically, East Barnet is in Hertfordshire, and is still in the Diocese of St Albans, but for local government purposes it is now part of the London Borough of Barnet.

Until 1866 the Rector of East Barnet was responsible for what was then the Chapel of Ease of St John the Baptist, Chipping Barnet, but which then became a separate parish.

The earliest memorials are those from the seventeenth century in the floor of the chancel, and it is clear that, as always, earlier memorials were lost during alterations. Some, recorded by Cass, are no longer visible, but are included in this list.

There are many legible tombstones in the extensive churchyard, and they have been recorded by the North Middlesex Family History Society. The Burial Register is in the care of the Rector, and has been indexed by the Society. Copies of the Index are held by the Society and at Barnet Museum, and are available for reference. (See back cover for further information.)

BEGINNING AT THE EAST END OF THE CHURCH

The East Window

This has three vertical sections portraying The Annunciation (Be thou highly favoured – Be it unto me according to thy word), the Crucifixion (Behold the Lamb of God), and the Resurrection (He is not here: He is risen – Go quickly and tell his disciples). Along the bottom of the three windows are the words:
